RIISING AND FALLING INTONATION IN QUESTIONS WITH ALTERNATIVES

Use rising and falling intonation in questions with alternatives.

For example:

Does the bathroom have a SHOWER or a BATHtub?

Exercise 1 Read and practice.

1. Is the bathroom UPstairs or DOWNstairs?
2. Are there TWO or THREE bedrooms?
3. Is the building on FOURTH or FIFTH Avenue?

Use rising intonation for each item in a series and falling intonation on the final item.

For example:

There is a FREEZER, a STOVE, and a MICROwave.

Exercise 2 Read and practice.

1. There is a NIGHT table, a DRESSer and a LAMP.
2. There is a GARage and an Elevator.
3. There are twenty-five BEDrooms and ten BATHrooms.

Exercise 3 Listen to the Conversation Model on page 55 of the Student's Book and repeat after the pauses.

Rachel: Do you live in a HOUSE or an aPARTment?

Pat: An aPARTment.

Rachel: What's it LIKE?

Pat: Well, there are three BEDrooms and a large KITCHen.

Rachel: Sounds NICE!
